



- Outdoor programming to allow us to gather during the pandemic including Dig Like an Archeologist for children, WWII Living Experience events, the Historic Harvest Festival, and Hops and History: A Celebration of Brewing in Stearns County
- New community connection opportunities such as Donuts With the Director on Saturday mornings, a website expansion, and the new Minnesota Voices Book Club with UniteCloud to connect history to diversity, equity and inclusion topics that impact our community

It is this resiliency that keeps the Stearns History Museum moving forward and will help us to serve our community for years to come.

Collections & Exhibits

2021 is in the books. It most defiantly did not go quietly into that good night. Although the world outside was turned upside down, here at the museum, snug and warm in the safety of our cinderblock, we focused on positive change. Perhaps if we could kindle a light in the darkness, no matter how small, some would sneak out into the greater good.

In Exhibits and Collections, we began January by tearing out approximately a third of the mezzanine in the main gallery space, which cleared the path for a complete redesign of that portion of the gallery. Next came brand new carpeting, paint and millwork.

New gallery space means new exhibits. Rising to The Crisis, 33rd and Cooper, and a rejiggering of the granite exhibit resulted. Traveling exhibits continued to be hosted in the lobby and Galleys 2&3, including the Minnesota's Secret Language School, League of Women Voters, Why We Fight, and Green Card Voices.

Collaboration with Programs continued throughout the year. We produced a 20-plus minute video, "I'll Be Seeing You," which was designed to support the WWII exhibit as well as be a stand-alone tool for school groups and

educational programming. We hosted two WWII living history events, a fall Harvest Festival and Hops and History, showcasing the history of brewing in Stearns County. We also continued to create videos and online content.


February saw the addition of Registrar Greta Beck to the staff. With Greta on board we were really able to grab the collections tiger by the tail and snap it into shape. We caught up with accessioning for the first time in years and made fantastic progress with collections management. Alas, Greta moved to Wyoming in October to pursue other interests — we wish her well!

As the year drew to a close, we began preparing for the upcoming accreditation inspection which demands that we have all of our ducks in a neat and organized row. That project will be a focus in 2022 as well as some major policy rewrites.

2021 was a difficult year for everybody, but I believe that we made the best of it and continue to make major strides into the future.

The post reached 37,000-plus people with 2,500-plus reactions, comments and shares.

This post reached 16,000-plus people with 1,000-plus reactions, comments and shares. Around 600 likes, or other reactions, were from shares alone. The reach again was completely organic.

When I think back on 2021 ...

I think about trying new things and letting our creativity kind of run wild. We were not sure what we would even be able to do, programmatically speaking. We knew there would be videos and virtual events, but we also knew that we wanted to bring our members and visitors back to the museum. That meant being both innovative and flexible with the 2021 slate of programs.

- We brought back our WWII Living History
 event, but split it into two separate weekends.
 The first event focused on the military aspect,
 with antique vehicles and reenactors in uniform,
 while the second weekend focused on life on the
 Homefront. I also put my newly-acquired video
 making skills to use by creating a 20-minute video
 for the new WWII exhibit, which premiered that
 weekend and is still on display.
- We also saw 2021 as an opportunity to launch our Minnesota Voices Book Club with Christopher Lehman starting us off with a two-part discussion of his book, Slavery's Reach: Southern Slaveholders in the North Star State. So far, these talks have been conducted virtually, via Zoom, but that could change as things begin to shift over the next year or so.
- In the past, one of our biggest Fall events was Halloween Historia. But we saw the COVID break as the right time to shift our fall programming back towards history and celebrate two things that have a rich past in Stearns County: agriculture and brewing. We did this with our Family Harvest Festival and then our Hops and History: A Celebration of Brewing event. Both events took place mostly on our Museum Plaza, and everyone who attended had a blast. They will both be back in 2022
- Of course, we continued putting content on YouTube, although we definitely had to slow down due to the return of in-person programming. But our most recent series, Now and Then, has been pretty popular, so if you haven't checked it out yet, please do!

IT'S HERE!

Our new catalog, launched in August, totals over 90,000 records of which 40,000 are newly searchable. What does this mean? Instead of a summary of contents, researchers can now dig deeper in our archival collections to find specific materials. So, improved search results! The catalog also allows staff to create online photo exhibits and researchers to save search results to a personalized list. Keep an eye out for exciting projects! We are grateful for support from the Institute of Museum and Library Services that allowed us to complete one of our long-term goals.

COLLECTION STORAGE SHELVES, BOXES, AND MORE

Staff have been working over the past year to increase space for incoming collections while managing our current holdings. The process involves streamlining the content of storage boxes, reorganizing materials, and of course, purchasing shelves. Thanks in part to a generous donor, area Stearns County Lions Clubs, and a Central Minnesota Library Exchange grant, we were able to expand our storage options to better preserve our materials while making them more accessible.

HITTING THE ROAD

How are our collections used? Really, across the board. Our photographs, documents, and recordings help others tell a story in a variety of formats outside the organization.

- KSTP TV Minneapolis/St. Paul used photos from our collection in their feature about Samuel Pandolfo and the Pan Motor Company.
- SHM partnered with GREAT Theatre to provide information for their summer children's camp.
- Organizers planning an All-School Reunion for District 63 in Zion Township are utilizing our photos and documents in their upcoming celebration.
- Over two dozen Sinclair Lewis and Stearns County Main Street photos were incorporated into the online production, "The Life and Loves of Sinclair Lewis," produced by Jim Gambone.
- A Norwegian researcher published a book that featured one his St. Cloud Swedish relatives.

Development

2021 was a year of continued opportunities for growth in the world of Development! With COVID-19's on-going impact, general funding and event sponsorship were ever-changing and we found our biggest successes through community partnerships. Four local breweries — Bad Habit, Beaver Island, Pantown, and Third Street — and one cidery — Milk & Honey — joined us for our first Hops & History: A Celebration of Brewing in Stearns County event last fall, now to be an annual tradition. Continued support from UniteCloud ensured that our book club moved forward, giving voice to often absent narratives through the work of Minnesota authors. County Lions Clubs stepped up to purchase shelving and archival boxes for their records in the archives. Volunteers from regional reenacting groups brought WWII to life over the summer. Individual donors provided support for building updates and repairs.


Most importantly, however, was the unwavering contribution of our members. More than 500 members continued their active engagement with the Museum, both virtually and in person. Membership at all levels is a cornerstone that supports daily operations here at SHM and we look forward to celebrating those who have remained steady through a tumultuous few years in May of

2022 with a member appreciation picnic! A new business member program was also launched in 2021, with 23 county entrepreneurs committing to the preservation of the history of work in our region. We will continue to grow and foster those new partnerships as we move forward.

Grant funding also helped move specific projects forward, including an Inspire for Small Museums grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services which was awarded in the fall of 2020 and completed in the fall of 2021. This grant enabled the Research Center and Archives to migrate our online catalog to a new platform, making it more user friendly and accessible. We look forward to the growth of this catalog to include new archival collection records.

We also worked with Sherburne, Benton, and Morrison County museums to prepare and apply for funding through the Central Minnesota Arts Board to support a month-long virtual cultural and heritage series about the work of the Minnesota African American Heritage Museum and Gallery around the topic of race and community.

Development at the Stearns History Museum is always a work in progress. Thanks for helping us learn, grow, and thrive in Central Minnesota!


